Discover

- Research the axolotl's natural wetland habitat, Lake Xochimilco in Mexico.
- There are very few axolotls left in the wild. Do some research and find out how scientists and farmers are helping the axolotl regain its lost habitat.

connect

- Talk to a naturalist or other expert about Iowa's wetlands and why they are important.
- Axolotls are amphibians. Investigate what amphibians live in your area.
- The word "axolotl" means "water dog" or "water monster" in Nahuatl, the Aztec language. What does your name mean? Find out its unique meaning or origins.
- Like the axolotl's habitat, the place where you live is also unique! Visit or learn about something that is unique to your hometown or area.
- Axolotls are able to regenerate limbs—that's almost like magic! Make a list of your special skills or talents.

Take action

- Share what you have learned about axolotls, amphibians, or wetlands to educate others! Make a video, infographic, poster, or other project to share what you have learned.
- Make a plan with your family or troop for ways to conserve water or reduce water pollution.
- Make an "all about me" poster or other project of your choice to share your name's meaning, your skills, and your magic with others.
- Teach a friend or family member about your favorite hobby, then learn about theirs.
- Have a talent show with your family or troop, where each person shares their favorite skill or hobby.
